Earthy, warm tones such as rust, burnt orange, wine red, and ochre added warmth, elegance, and dramatic depth to modern living spaces.






### Tribal-inspired motifs

#### **Avocado marble**



Blurred, smoky finishes and artistic textures turned glass into something more - soft, luminous, and emotional.








#### **Chestnut wood**
